### None of you can be my disciple ...

In the Gospel for this Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Jesus presents to the great crowds that were following him the price or the reality of being his disciple. There are three different ways Jesus talks about being a disciple: "If any man comes to me without hating his father, mother, wife, children, brothers, sisters, yes and his own life too, he cannot be my disciple." The second follows on immediately: "Anyone who does not carry his cross and come after me cannot be my disciple," and the third: "... none of you can be my disciple unless he gives up all his possessions."

We can be surprised by the language Jesus uses in this passage, especially the word "hate". It is a word that is almost the exact opposite of how Jesus lives his life, normally speaks and the message of God's love that he came to proclaim. But, perhaps, it is so effective because it is a word that Jesus so rarely uses. I do not believe that Jesus is actually saying that we have to hate our families and even ourselves before we can become disciples of Jesus.

Jesus does not just say that we have to "hate" our families, even ourselves to be his disciples. Jesus also uses the idea of carrying our cross and coming after him and finally giving up all our possessions are necessary for us to be his disciples. Jesus demands that to be his disciple we are completely free without any hindrance or holding onto anything.

I do think that Jesus is once again using hyperbole to illustrate a point. For the vast majority of the members of the Church, Jesus' literal teaching on discipleship today would preclude them from being disciples. Would you give up your job, your car, your house, your children to be a follower of Jesus? Of course not, but I still think it is a valuable lesson for us to reflect on.

The truth is the most valuable things in our lives are not our possessions. We do not own them. Certainly for those who are parents, your children, especially when they were babies depended on you for everything, they did not have much of a say in any aspect of their lives. But even then, they were not 'yours'. I believe one of the elements that Jesus is asking of us is to ensure that we are not overly possessive of things, which may mean we are unable to be generous, unable to be free enough to follow the Lord.

This is especially the case with those elements of our lives that are not objects or things. For most sports, equipment is required and these can be "ours". But the skills to use that equipment are different, they are not "ours" in the same way. Anyone who has been privileged to teach or coach someone new in a sport or skill knows the thrill of seeing them get it, seeing them mastering that and gaining confidence. In a similar way, our knowledge, our learning is not really ours, are we generous in sharing it?

The other element in our Gospel today is two stories that Jesus tells to further talk about the cost of discipleship. In the stories Jesus illustrates the importance of planning. A person building a tower, needs to work out that they can finish the tower before they start building, otherwise people will laugh at them. Or again, if war is approaching and the king does not think he can win, he will send envoys to sue for peace, before the fighting begins. Jesus wants us to know the cost of discipleship very early on. He is being completely open with us. To be a disciple of Jesus will 'cost' and Jesus wants us to know the level of that cost from the very beginning. To be a disciple will mean letting go of everything, of things that perhaps we are most proud of, are we willing to pay the price?
