### **About the Sacrament of Holy Orders?**

Holy Orders is the Sacrament by which a person is called to the *ordained ministry* in the Church. Through this sacrament, the mission entrusted by Christ to his apostles continues to be exercised in the Church.

This Sacrament is a kind of 'three-part' Sacrament. The three 'orders' that comprise this Sacrament are: Diaconate (Deacons), Presbyterate (Priests) and Episcopate (Bishops). A Bishop receives the fullness of the Sacrament of Holy Orders and is a true successor of the Apostles. He shares in the priesthood of Christ and stands in the person of Christ as chief minister of the Sacraments in his diocese. He also shares in Christ's mission of governance of his diocese and is responsible for the preaching of the Gospel. A priest is ordained as coworker with the Bishop, sharing in his priestly ministry of sanctifying, governing and preaching, in a subordinate way. A Deacon is ordained not to the priesthood of Christ, but to service in his name, and is called to be a sacrament of Christ who made himself servant of all. The Deacon also shares in some of the liturgical functions of the bishop and priest, such as baptising, officiating at weddings, presiding at funerals, giving blessings and so on.

These three orders are parts of the one Sacrament. Each of them gives to the one who receives the Sacrament an 'imprint' which cannot be removed and which configures them to Christ in a unique way. Above all, the purpose of this Sacrament of ordination is to serve the Body of Christ, the Church, by making Christ sacramentally present.

#### **XVI ORDINARY GENERAL ASSEMBLY** OF THE SYNOD OF BISHOPS



In March 2020, Pope Francis announced that the theme for the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops would be "For a Synodal nodal Church Church: Communion, Parnion | participation | mission ticipation and Mission".

The journey towards the celebration of the Synod in October 2023 was solemnly opened on October 9-10, 2021 in Rome, and then on October 17 in each particular location. This event is the start of a two-year global consultation process.

The Catholic Church in Australia will invite the People of God to make submissions via an online portal that will open on October 17. Those submissions will help the Bishops develop a national report to support the global process, leading to an international gathering in Rome in 2023. There will also be a process of consultation in local parishes happening, which will also form part of our Diocesan response to the national report.


#### PASTORAL COUNCIL RECOMMENDATIONS
