Did you know... =

About Christian Hospitality?

St Paul tells us that as Christians we should have a special care for hospitality (Romans 12:13). This command should make us ask ourselves, "Are our churches *welcoming places*?" Hospitality is a sign of love, and love is a sign of Christ's presence.

So what can we do to make sure our church is a place of hospitality? One of the simplest and most obvious ways is to look out for anyone who is new to the community and introduce yourself. Often unintentionally, we neglect the newcomer to our Church; it's amazing how much of a difference it can make to a visitor or a new parishioner to be greeted by a smiling face, rather than to be ignored. Another simple gesture is to make a point of spending a few minutes after Mass to say hi to and get to know some of our fellow Massgoers whom we rarely or never speak to.

Hospitality is at least as important as any Christian doctrine or ritual, and one of the most valuable tools of evangelisation. If we proclaim our prayers and read the scriptures with our mouths, yet refuse to welcome the stranger or let a sharp tongue inflict hurt on another, then we are hypocrites, and we even become an obstacle to the faith of others. The Letter to the Hebrews tells us not to "neglect hospitality, since through it, some have unknowingly entertained angels" (Heb 13:2). May our parish be known for our hospitality to all.

RECEPTION OF THE CHALICE

Bishop Michael has announced that reception of the Blood of Christ from the chalice at Holy Communion can now take place once again in our churches. This practice was suspended when the COVID-19 pandemic began and it is now time to re-introduce it. Therefore, from this weekend, Communion under both forms (host and chalice) will be available at Mass.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal says: "Holy Communion has a fuller form as a sign when it is distributed under both kinds. For in this form the sign of the Eucharistic banquet is more clearly evident." (GIRM 281) Nevertheless, all Catholics are free to choose whether to receive Holy Communion under one kind or both kinds.

Since it has been nearly four years since this practice was available, it is worth recalling some basic elements of the reception of Holy Communion:

- If you receive from the chalice, respond "Amen" when the minister says "The Blood of Christ".
 Then take the chalice in both hands, take a small sip, and hand the chalice back carefully to the minister.
- If you have any cold or flu symptoms, please do not receive from the chalice.
- Please do not take the host and dip it into the chalice (intinction); self-intinction is forbidden by church law.
- If you receive under only one kind (host or chalice), you still receive the complete presence of Christ: body, blood, soul and divinity.

Some general points about receiving the host (the Body of Christ):

- If receiving in the hand, place your hands flat with palms up, and allow the minister to place the host onto your hand; then take the host and place it in your mouth immediately.
- Do not return to your seat still holding the host.
- Reception on the tongue is once again permitted; be sure to open your mouth and extend your tongue.
