Did you know?

THE SIGN OF PEACE

Did you know that the Sign of Peace at Mass isn't just a friendly handshake or greeting? It's actually a sacred gesture rooted in the early Church (see: Apostolic Constitutions from the 4th Century) and guided by clear instructions in the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* (GIRM #82 & #154). Placed just before Communion, it expresses our desire for peace, reconciliation, and unity as the Body of Christ—preparing our hearts to receive the Eucharist.

The priest first prays for peace and unity in the Church and the world. He then offers Christ's peace to the people, saying, "The peace of the Lord be with you always." It is not the simple wishing of peaceful goodwill or peaceful greetings from the priest personally to everyone else.

The deacon or priest may then invite the congregation to offer each other a sign of this peace which they have just received with each other. This gesture too is not then the simple wishing of peace from one person to another. It is the expression of the faithful's peaceful ecclesial communion and mutual charity with one another before they together receive the sacrament of this communion in the Eucharist.

So next time you offer peace at Mass, remember—it's more than courtesy. It's a prayerful sign of unity in Christ.

DOMESTIC & FAMILY VIOLENCE PREVENTION MONTH

The Diocesan Social Justice Group draws your attention to Domestic and Family Violence Prevention Month being marked in Queensland during May. For reflection, they have prepared a document drawn from the Australian Bishops' Social Justice Statement from 2022 - 2023, titled "Respect: Confronting Violence and Abuse.". Many have spoken out to highlight the extent of abuse throughout society - in homes, workplaces and community, including the Church. Those who suffer abuse are mostly women and children, while perpetrators are most frequently men. The damage to the lives of victims and survivors is real, destructive and long-lasting. The teaching of Christ urges us to promote relationships marked by respect, freedom, mutual esteem and kindness. We invite you to delve deeper into this through the Bishops' statement itself, available online, and our excerpt document.



TEN YEARS OF LAUDATO SI'

First published by Pope Francis on 24 May 2015, Laudato Si' focuses on caring for our Common Home. It is the Church's response to the ecological crisis that is present in our world in this age, and it brings together evidence from ecology, guidance from Christian theology and ethics, and promotes concern for creation through the lens of economic political, and spiritual wisdom. Names after St. Francis of Assisi's famous hymn, is a document with a big vision in the way it addresses critical global challenges, such as, pollution and climate change; biodiversity loss; the water crisis; the decline in human life quality; and weak international responses to these problems. In the encyclical, Pope Francis highlighted how these issues are traced back to excessive consumption and a disregard for the environment as the life-giving structure that supports all life on our planet. Pope Francis tried to offer the world a message of hope that in caring for God's gift of creation we in turn care for all of us, especially those who live in poor and vulnerable nations and communities.

Through Laudato Si' Pope Francis aimed for the Catholic Church to influence the world at the level of international politics but there is much in the encyclical that encourages us to act locally. Let our faith communities respond to the message of Laudato Si' by being champions of care for God's creation and add our voice to support the well-being of the planet and humanity. By simply highlighting the tenth anniversary of Laudato Si' this Saturday, May 24th we do can do that and emphasise that its message is a priority for us.
