ABOUT ANGELS?

The concept of angels seems to be a popular one these days, even among people who do not claim to be Christian. Unfortunately, most of the popular obsession with angels is anything but Christian. They tend to portray angels either as cute and cuddly wish-granters or as mysterious forces that help channel one's own 'inner power', and usually make no reference to God. Neither of these images is true to what the Scriptures tell us about angels.

In the bible, angels are messengers and servants of God. They are pure spirits with no physical bodies whose role is to carry out the will of God and speak messages from God in special circumstances. They are in heaven, continually contemplating the face of God. Angels are far from being cute, innocuous and meek; the Scriptures frequently show them as being strong, powerful, even fierce. They are not there to grant wishes like a magic genie – their sole purpose is to obey and carry out the will of God, and they assist and protect us in our efforts to carry out God's will too.

The angels (together with the saints) are joined with us most powerfully in the Mass, where they too acclaim and worship God as they gather with us around the altar to worship the God who becomes present in the Eucharist.
